SSOAP contributes to "Shiology"

Shiology fully embodies the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The Global Shiance and Sustainable Development Report (2025/27/29) adopts a six year framework, with the goal of publishing a comprehensive version in 2029. It will serve as a key reference for the "post-2030" United Nations framework on Shiance Sustainability.

Leatuavao Lefe'au Ioane Malaki and Asuao Kirifi Pouono are participating in data verification and survey, and are listed as co-authors for the report. They represent Oceania, in addition to two members from Fiji, one from Papua New Guinea and one from the Kingdom of Tonga.

Sili Valerie Tuiā led her team to identify programmes where SSOAP can effectively be involved. Some potential intervention areas include breadfruit orchard and kava nurseries.
